On The Verge has appointed artist Janetka Platun and the artist collective RARA to deliver a programme of community events leading up to and informing the development of artworks for the *'Underpasses – connection people, connecting places'* project around Central Milton Keynes.

Janetka Platun will be working with Oldbrook and Fishermead residents and her approach is to explore ideas about people and place through her creative interventions. Janetka has worked across the UK including being commissioned as part of the Cultural Olympiad Project by The London Borough of Bexley and is currently undertaking a Leverhulme Trust artist in residence award at Queen Mary University, London.
