



Big Draw - Friday 14th October

Drop in between 11.30am and 2.00pm then 2.00pm to 4.30pm

Location: Oldbrook - Fishermead underpass connecting Oldbrook via Sutcliff Avenue to Fishermead.

Join artist Janetka Platun at the underpass. The workshop will be a moment to pause, reflect and decipher your heritage.

The public are invited to record their significant moments to be included in an artistically assembled register. Cast in shadow, the concealed space will be animated with a table, chairs, typewriter, telephone and lighting dating from 1967.

Contribute alternative points in your life over the past 50 years as you pass through the dark underpass from one location, before emerging in another.

This is free activity with all materials provided.

Janetka Platun will be running events for residents of the Fishermead and Oldbrook over the the next few months, gathering stories and talking to people about their impressions and experiences of using the underpass.

So come along and get involved in part of the world's biggest celebration of drawing between 11.30am and 2.00pm or on the other side of the underpass between 2.00pm and 4.30pm on Friday 14th October with the opportunity to contribute and share your thoughts on what is being proposed.

On the Verge and its partners MK Council, The Parks Trust MK and the MK City Discovery Centre, are delivering the yearlong 'Underpasses' project with funding from the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF), the MK Community Foundation and MK Council. On the Verge is a Community Interest Company.

Janetka Platun has worked across the UK including being commissioned as part of the Cultural Olympiad Project by The London Borough of Bexley and is currently undertaking a Leverhulme Trust artist in residence award at Queen Mary University, London.
