



Artist-led workshops launch 'Underpass' project within Conniburrow and Downs Barn.

Artist collective RARA, appointed by On The Verge, will be delivering the first community workshops look to reimage the underpass between Conniburrow and Downs Barn next to Marlborough Street. A programme of community events leading up to and informing the development of artworks for the underpasses will be taking place on the 23rd, 24th, 30th and 31st August at Conniburrow Community Centre.

RARA are looking for pioneering local residents to help create a performance based on their stories of moving to Milton Keynes. Over 4 workshops they will be creating words, actions and objects for an event that will accompany an art installation in the underpass between Conniburrow and Downs Barn. The workshops will be taking place between 11.00am-2.00pm over the four days.

No experience is necessary, all the workshops are free and a delicious lunch will be provided.
